2018 Annual Report

Mission: First Impressions of Routt County works to ensure that young children will be provided adequate resources and quality programs to promote healthy development and school readiness.

Vision: The First Impressions Council strengthens the community's collaborative web of resources where children and families experience dignity and a sense of belonging.

Goals:

- 1. Increase Infant Toddler Capacity
- 2. Recruit, Retain and Fairly Compensate Early Childhood Professionals
- 3. Access for all to quality early care and education programs
- Increase Infant Toddler Capacity Routt County has an average birth rate of 220 births a year. 77% of families with children under the age of 6 have both parents in the workforce.
 Licensed capacity for children ages 6 weeks to two years old. This reflects meeting 21% of the estimated need.
- 2. Recruit, Retain and Fairly Compensate Early Childhood Professionals A highly qualified early childhood workforce results in positive outcomes for children in their care and satisfied teachers/providers that stay in the field.
 First Impressions Professional Development Program

 29 Early childhood professionals received professional development funding to complete 141 college credits in Early Childhood Education Program. This is an increase from 23 early childhood professionals in 2017 and 101 college credits.
 97% Retention for early childhood professionals that benefitted from professional development funding compared to 96% retention for 2017.
 74% Retention for early childhood professionals that received professional development funding in 2016 and were still in the field at the end of 2018.

Early childhood professionals report they appreciate receiving this support and the impact of the opportunity to engage, learn, and share ideas with their peers in class.

*\$22,813 in professional development funding covered 90% of the costs for tuition and books.

*\$9,947 leveraged by the student's 10% portion and the College Opportunity Fund stipend through the Colorado Northwestern Community College.



Teaching Strategies GOLD (2017-2018 Child Outcomes)

91% of four-year olds were rated by their early childhood teacher as meeting or exceeding developmental milestones in the following areas: social-emotional, physical, language, cognitive, literacy, and math. This was 87% for the 2016-2017 school year.
